

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

"Equestrian Canada is committed to: upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities; requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment; ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors, or their agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose; providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure; providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives; continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition; and reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane."

The Kelowna Riding Club Hunter Jumper Spring Classic 2025 is sanctioned as a BRONZE competition of Equestrian Canada, c/o House of Sport, 2451 Riverside Dr., Ottawa, On., K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC (A602.1). Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition (A602.7). It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.



When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached.

Coaches from other countries must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance.

See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Sec on A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. ARTICLE A102 SAFE SPORT ENVIRONMENTS

- 1. Effective 2022, EC Sport License holders at least 18 years of age must complete recognized safe sport training modules addressing the recognition and prevention of maltreatment in sport and concussion.
 - 2. Effective 2022, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC sanctioned events.

ECSPORTLICENSING 2024 SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

 The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES:

 Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

 Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2024: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES

 Athletes without a designated coach can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form.

Rules, Regulations, and General Information

The 2025 KRC Hunter and Jumper Spring Classic Horse Show is sanctioned as a Bronze competition of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC (A602.1). Current Horse Council BC and EC Bronze memberships are required. All classes are run as miscellaneous classes and are not rated for EC awards. and are covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2) EC Horse Recordings are not required.

MANAGEMENT

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, arising out of, or incident to the KRC Horse Shows without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision is final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders exhibitors, prohibit claim damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges, and to change specifications in jumper classes.

JUNIOR AGES

Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.

Junior "A" - a rider who is 15, 16, or 17 on January 1, 2025.

Junior "B" - a rider who is 12, 13, or 14 on January 1, 2025.

Junior "C" - a rider who is 11 or under on January 1, 2025. Article G1006.2

ENTRIES EC, HC AND BCHJA MEMBERSHIPS

All owners, riders, lessees and trainers must be current members of Horse Council BC and hold a minimum of a current EC Bronze membership. For competitors wishing to collect BCHJA year end points at BCHJA sanctioned competitions, all riders and trainers/coaches must be current, members of BCHJA.

EC/HC ENTRY AGREEMENT

By signing the entry form you agree to the following statement: "I hereby certify that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and rules of Equine Canada at this competition. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless EC, the competition, their officials, organizers, agents, employees and their representatives. The person responsible (PR) agrees to the release of any information on the entry form to EC." (A802.4). In the event that an exhibitor participates in an Equine Canada sanctioned competition where approved headgear is required for juniors, he/she will wear a properly fitted, ASTM or BSI/BS EN approved helmet. It is understood that competitors not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete at these competitions. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC Sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. A person responsible (PR) must sign the competition entry form. PR must be an EC Sport License holder in good standing OR in the case of junior entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR. Art A213.2. In the case of USEF member entries PR must be a USEF member in good standing.

It is understood that competitors not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete at these competitions. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC Sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. A person responsible (PR) must sign the competition entry form. PR must be an EC Sport License holder in good standing OR in the case of junior entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR. Art A213.2. In the case of USEF member entries PR must be a USEF member in good standing.

SAFE SPORT

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

For each horse entered please complete a separate entry form to include: owner and rider information, (entries may be made in the name of a farm/stable provided the name is registered with EC), all membership numbers, signatures, payment for: classes entered, stabling or haul-in fees, exhibitor fees, drug fees, GST and warm-up fees if required. Payment can be made with a credit card, with the entry on-line at www.horseshowtime.com, or e transfer to payment@kelownaridingclub.ca, or paid with a cheque, payable to KRC in Canadian Funds, mailed with the entry form to 3745 Gordon Drive, Kelowna, BC, V1W 4M8.

NUMBERS

Numbers will NOT be issued unless all signatures are in place, all memberships are current and listed, and all fees have been paid by cheque or credit card. This includes: fully paid current owner, rider and trainer, Horse Council and EC memberships, all signatures, and all entries paid in full. A credit card number or an open cheque must be left with the entry secretary if competitors wish to add classes during the competition. Equitation riders not riding their own horse must sign the form (and have a parent or guardian sign if a junior rider) for the horse they are riding and use that horse's number. Every entry must be provided an identification number by the competition organizing committee which must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. Article A814.

RETURNED PAYMENT

Cheques returned by the bank for any reason will be assessed a penalty of \$50.00. Payment must be repaid within 10 days and be paid by certified cheques, money order, cash, Visa or Mastercard and must include the \$50.00 fee.

POST ENTRIES

Horses entering after the start of the show will pay a late fee of \$35 and be subject to all add/scratch fees. Show entries will close on April 21, 2025.

SUBSTITUTIONS

With a Veterinarian's certificate a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. There will be a \$25 substitution fee and all monies will be transferred to the new horse.

ADD/SCRATCHES: CHANGE POLICY

- ALL entries will be charged a one-time \$25.00 fee for adding, scratching or changing classes.
- A credit card or open cheque must be left at the show office before any add/scratch/changes will be processed.
- Any class adds, scratches, or changes MUST be made in the show office in writing no later than $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after the last class the day before the class is scheduled.

SAME DAY CLASS ADD, SCRATCH, CHANGES

- Scratching or changing a class at the gate will not constitute an official scratch or change. Scratches and changes MUST be made in the office before the start of the class for a full refund.
- Same day class adds will be charged a \$5.00 fee per class.
- Classes CAN NOT be added or changed once the class starts.
- Competitors that go into a class without entering will pay double the fee of the class.

REFUNDS

- CANCELLATION BEFORE CLOSING DATE Before closing date of entries a full refund will be given.
- CANCELLATION AFTER CLOSING DATE BUT BEFORE THE START OF THE HORSE SHOW STALL FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED. Upon the presentation of a Vet Slip to the entry secretary the entry fees, exhibitor fees, and warm up fees will be refunded, minus an office fee of \$25 or 15% whichever is greater.
- CANCELLATION AFTER THE START OF THE HORSE SHOW Upon presentation of a Vet Slip to the entry secretary, class fees for the classes that have not been shown in, will be refunded, minus a \$25 or 15% fee whichever is greater. Stall fee and exhibitor fees will not be refunded.

NON-SHOWING FEE

All Non-Showing horses and riders will be charged \$50.00

EXHIBITOR FEE

All entries will be charged a \$50.00 fee.

CHECK OUT

All accounts must be checked out at the end of the show. Any account that is not checked by 5 pm Sunday will be charged as is and will not be open to dispute after the show.

HORSE RECORDINGS

Horse Recordings are not required at KRC Bronze rated competitions.

DRUG AND MEDICATION RULE

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location. All showing horses will be charged a \$4.00 drug fee. This fee will be forwarded directly to Equestrian Canada. Article A1008.1.

BARN BILLS & TRAINER SPLITS

Trainers requiring barn bills must set them up at the beginning of the horse show with a credit card or open cheque. Trainer splits must be done by no later than Saturday.

NON STABLING FEE

Horses that are not renting a stall and are trailering in and out must pay a haul in fee of \$25 per horse per day. Horses hauling in for warm-up day only, will pay the following fee per horse. \$20.00 haul-in, \$25 administration fee and the cost of warm- up ticket(s).

SCHOOLING Schooling will be available for hunters and jumpers over a posted course on Thursday from 9:00am to 5:00pm. The cost is \$25.00 for the day. Sand Hunter Ring, Fences - 2'6" – 2'9". Sand Jumper Ring, Fences 0.75m(2'6") and 0.90m(3'0"). Numbers must be worn for schooling. Riders wishing to show only on schooling day may do 8 so, but must fill out a waiver, obtain a number and pay appropriate fees in the show office before schooling. Adults are permitted to ride ponies in schooling areas and in non-judged warm-up rounds. FEI schooling rules will be used. Horses hauling in for warm-up day only, will pay the following fee per horse. \$15.00 haul-in, \$25 administration fee and the cost of warm-up.

VACCINATIONS

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations.

BIOSECURITY Kelowna Riding Club is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All horses are required to have a BioSecurity Form (located online and at back of Prize Book) submitted to the show office prior to receiving their competition number. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days.

STABLING and CLEAN OUT

Stalls occupied by a horse will be available at the rate of \$225.00 per stall plus unlimited shavings. Tack stalls will be awarded based on availability. There will be an additional \$50.00 charge per horse stall for clean out. Once the stall has been broom-swept clean upon departure (including all hay, garbage, etc.) and the horse show office has been notified, the \$50.00 will be refunded. There will be no stall clean out fee refund if the horse show office has not been notified. Stabling will be available beginning Wednesday morning after 9AM, ending Sunday. Please contact Jan at hjshow@kelownaridingclub.com to book stalls. *KRC Members pay \$200.00 per stall for the show.

BEDDING Bedding is available on the show grounds and are included in your stabling price.

MANURE

Manure must be placed in the designated area. Trash must be kept separate from manure and placed in appropriate receptacles.

HAUL IN FEE

Horses that are not renting a stall and are trailering in and out must pay a daily haul in fee of \$30.00 per horse per event (\$25.00/day for members).

EC PROTOCOL

CONCUSSION

Accidents & Return to Play rule: In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel on-site before continuing to compete. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the on-site medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition. If on-site qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released. Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return to Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC. No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list. 9

FALLS

All competitors that have had a fall during training/warm up on the Competition site or in the Competition Arena/Field of Play must be assessed by qualified medical personnel onsite before they either take part in another test or competition. Competitors must not re-mount their horse until this assessment has been completed. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. Section A General Rules 101.2 ABUSE Abuse of the horse is strictly forbidden. Abuse includes, but is not restricted to, excessive use of spurs, abuse of the whip and brutal use of the reins during halts or rein backs, repeated tugs on the horse's mouth. EC Section A, General Rules 517.

PROTESTS

Should any questions or disputes arise which are not provided for in the rulebooks, they shall be referred to the Show Committee whose decision will be final.

ATTIRE

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

At all EC-sanctioned competitions, anyone mounted on a horse, including foreign competitors, must wear approved equestrian head gear, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times. Article G102.1 Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.

DRESS

All competitors must be properly dressed in the confines of the arena. This includes the inspection of the course and at the presentation of prizes. Black or brown smooth leather half chaps are permittable providing they match the boot color. In jumper competitions open-neck polo shirts are allowed. No sweatshirts, t-shirts, tank tops or other similar dress will be permitted. Shirts must be neatly tucked into riding breeches. Article G109.

EARPHONES AND EARBUDS

Earphones/Earbuds and/or other electronic communication devices are strictly prohibited in the competition arena, and such usage is penalized by elimination. The use of only one earphone/earbud is allowed while mounted everywhere within the grounds of the Event except the competition arena. When mounted, only handsfree communication is permitted at MREC. Article G114.4

AWARDS

RIBBONS AND CHAMPIONSHIPS

All hunter, jumper and equitation classes will be placed 1st through 8th. Ribbons to 6th place. Championships will be awarded in divisions of 3 competitors or more. Specialty classes will be awarded ribbons to 8th.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money in regular classes will be divided as follows: 1st place-25%, 2nd place-17.5%, 3rd place-16.25%, 4th place 15%, 5th place 13.75%, 6th place 12.5%. Special classes will state the money breakdown in each class specification. Prize money will be paid in Canadian funds. All prize money will be put as a credit to the appropriate account, and anything owing will be deducted. The remaining prize money will be paid to the owner listed on the entry form unless other arrangements have been made. Prize money will be mailed within 30 days from the last day of the conclusion of the competition.

GENERAL INFORMATION

LIABILITY

All owners and competitors and trainers are personally responsible for damages to persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. The owners and competitors and trainers MUST have third party insurance to provide full coverage for participation in equestrian events at any of the KRC Hunter Jumper Shows. Neither KRC nor, nor their organizing committee, board of directors, sponsors, employees, volunteers nor contractors shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, death, damage, loss or any other matter that may happen, from any causes or circumstances whatsoever to competitors, exhibitors, or members of their family or their agents, or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on to KRC property, or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to any of the KRC Hunter Jumper Horse Shows.

HORSE SHOW OFFICE HOURS

The horse show office will be open Thursday from 8:00am to 6:00pm. During horse show days, the office will open one hour before the first class and until $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after the last class.

FOOTING

SMOKING

Please observe all posted signs and no smoking at least 10 meters for all barns.

FARRIER

A Farrier will be on call on the days of the show and on call for warm-up day.

DOGS

All dogs must be on a controlled leash on the show grounds. Absolutely no dogs in the schooling or show arenas at any time.

LONGEING

Longeing is permitted in the longeing sand ring until half an hour before the show begins each day.

HACKING

Hacking is permitted in the Hunter and Jumper Ring until half an hour before the show begins each day.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2).

FOOD SERVICE

A small cantina will be available on Thursday (Schooling Day). Food trucks will be on site Friday, Saturday & Sunday.

CAMPING

Limited camper and trailer parking is available in Designated areas. Showers and washroom facilities are available at no charge. No hook ups. Camping is \$50.00 for the entire stay of the show.

PARKING

There will be no parking whatsoever by the barn areas. A lot will be designated for car/truck and trailer parking. Parking will be under the direction of Show Management; please co-operate with the volunteers who co-ordinate parking.

IN THE EVENT OF A TIE FOR CHAMPIONSHIP

In the case of a tie for the Champion/Reserve, the highest placing in the largest prize money class of the division will be used. If all classes have same prize money, the highest placing in the last class of the division will be used.



Show Information:

THE CURRENT EC RULE BOOK WILL BE IN EFFECT

- All owners, riders, and trainers must have current HCBC memberships and minimum EC Bronze sport licences are required.
- Examination After a Fall: All competitors that have had a fall during training/warm up on the Competition site or in the Competition Arena/Field of Play must be assessed by qualified medical personnel onsite before they either take part in another test or competition. Competitors must not remount their horse until this assessment has been completed. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. A101.2
- Canadian coaches must hold a minimum Registered EC Coach status to coach at an EC Bronze sanctioned event.
- Horse recording and valid horse activation are not required.
- Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, be selected for equine medication control testing while at event location (A602.5).
- All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations (A602.8).
- Anyone mounted on a horse must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved helmet, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while on the competition grounds.
- Only horses wearing a competition number are allowed on the grounds during the schooling and competition days.
- Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.
- Appropriate footwear must be worn when mounted.
- Junior riders must not ride or handle stallions anywhere on the competition grounds.
- Manageable stallions ridden by Seniors are eligible for all Senior classes.
- Decisions as to the manageability of stallions are at the discretion of the judge or steward. Unmanageable stallions must be excused from the ring and/or warm-up ring.
- Any contestant demonstrating unsafe or unsportsmanlike behaviour will be disqualified for the remainder of the show without refund of entry fees.
- All dogs must be kept on a leash. Absolutely no dogs in the schooling area or show arenas at any time.
- All hunter, jumper and cross pole rings are sand.
- Tack stalls are available only at management's discretion.
- Longeing is permitted in the longeing sand ring until half an hour before the show begins each day.
- · Hacking is permitted in the Hunter Ring until half an hour before the show begins each day.
- Take practice fences so that the red flag is on your right.
- An EC Certified Coach must be present when a junior rider is jumping in the warm up ring.
- The management reserves the right to limit entries, or refuse an entry.
- The management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split classes depending on the number of entries received.
- The management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and correct any error or omission in the program.
- Protests or objections will be handled by the management.


