GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

"It is the responsibility of the show/event committee, or organizers and the facility owners and managers to ensure that all BC Health Authority, VIASPORT and WorkSafeBC directives are followed and enforced. Please follow all vaccination requirements as dictated by your Regional Health Authority. Horse Council is not a regulatory body and it is understood and agreed that sanctioning and approval of either a HCBC Provincial circuit event or Equestrian Canada Bronze or Silver competition relates to the use of the rule book and approved officials only".

This Competition is a Horse Council BC provincially sanctioned Competition and will be governed in accordance with the Horse Council BC Rule Book. Knowledge of the Rules is the responsibility of the Competitor.

Neither Horse Council BC, its Board of Directors, organizing committee, staff, volunteers, officials, or employees of this horse show, will be responsible in any way, for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors, spectators, owners, riders, trainers, or grooms. All competitors and owners of horses must be members of Horse Council BC to participate"

The abuse or inhumane treatment of a horse by an exhibitor, trainer or other person at an Equestrian Canada sanctioned competition shall not be tolerated under any circumstances. The competition organizing committee has the right to bar such violators from further participation in the competition if necessary.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

1. The management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and to correct any error or make any alterations that may be necessary in the prize list.

2. The management reserves the right to cancel or combine any class not filled to satisfaction; whereupon exhibitors will be notified as soon as possible after close of entries.

3. Management reserves the right to change the class order, if necessary, after the close of entries. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to determine when their classes will be judged.

4. Inhumane treatment of a horse will not be tolerated. Violation of this rule, at the discretion of the organization committee, will result in disqualification and forfeiture of fees.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

5. Any exhibitor using a wrong number, or having no number, may be excused, or disqualified from the class, at the judge's discretion.

6. Exhibitors are responsible for reporting all entries to the Starter, before each respective class is called. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to determine when their class will be judged. A gate hold will prevail as a courtesy only

7. Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, handler or rider, or any other person associated with a given entry will disqualify the horse, and result in forfeiture of entry fees for subsequent classes. Management reserves the right to remove a groom, handler/ rider and/ or horse from the show, without being liable for compensation.

8. No judge shall be approached regarding any decision during the time they are judging or are about to judge. Penalty will be disqualification from the show in its entirety.

9. The medical aid fee covers the cost of the medical aid on site. The fee does not cover personal expenses incurred by the injured party in the event of an injury or transportation by ambulance.

10. No person other than officials, staff on duty, and the judges of the classes may enter the competition rings without permission of the tournament management. Competitors are allowed in the competition rings only when competing, when the course is open for walking or during scheduled schooling rounds.

11. Dogs must be on a leash at all times.

12. Proper attire is always required in the show rings. Tucked in polo shirts may be worn in the Jumper Show Ring. Jackets are encouraged for Classic competitions, but not mandatory. Half chaps with paddock boots are permitted, but should be cleaned and presented in a matter that is respectful to the sport. Jackets and proper attire is mandatory for the Hunter Show Ring.

13. Lunging will be permitted in the hunter warm-up ring from 6:30 am to 7:15 am.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

Headgear

Anyone mounted on a horse, including foreign competitors, must wear ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) or BSI approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.

Every entry at an HCBC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to HCBC rules and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in HCBC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the HCBC constitution and the applicable rules of HCBC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this HCBC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of HCBC and any additional rules imposed by the competition."

STABLING & HAUL INS

1. Stabling will be available for the show on a first come first serve basis. Tack stalls are subject to availability, and are only approved after show entries are confirmed. If you are interested in a tack stall please let the office know and your name will be added to the request list.

- \$175 + GST for Kelowna Riding Club members.
- \$215 + GST for Non-members including tack and feed rooms.
- Type of stall (or Haul-In) desired must be indicated on entry form.
- 2. Hay is **not available** for sale from the show office.
- 3. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from show management.

STABLING & HAUL INS

4. Stabling will be available from 11:00 am on Thursday, Sep 28th, and must be vacated at the end of the day on Sunday. It is a \$40 charge to stay Wednesday or Sunday night.

5. Loose shavings will be available on site.

6. Stalls must be cleaned daily, and manure deposited in the areas provided (do not dump on gravel pad). Please do not mix other garbage with manure.

7. Haul-ins and Ride-Ins are welcome at a cost of \$25 per day and must be approved by the show office prior to the show, as there is a limited amount of haul in parking.

8. Day stalls not available.

9. Stalls may be bedded with shavings ONLY.

10. Stall plaques, numbers, or signage may not be changed without management's permission. Doing so will result in a \$50 charge.

11. Stall must be stripped at the end of the show. There will be a \$75 clean out deposit charged to each horse as cash or on a separate cheque from show fees. Deposit will be returned upon verification that the stall has been stripped.

SCHOOLING & WARM UP

1. Arena will be open for hacking, but not jumping at times indicated on the Daily Schedule.

2. Lunging is permitted in the hunter warm up ring during the morning hack period indicated on the schedule. There will be no lunging in the competition ring at any time.

3. Ticketed Schooling will be available on Thursday (Move-in) day at the cost of \$15.00 per ticket +tax in the jumper ring and \$30.00+tax for the hunter schooling.

ENTRIES

1. A deposit payment must accompany all entries – stabling fee, warm up, mandatory show fees. Payment may be made by E-transfer, cheque, credit card, or cash. Entries without deposit will be considered late. In case of event being sold out, entries without deposit will not have a spot held.

NSF fee of \$45.00 will be charged for any dishonoured cheques, or declined credit cards.

2. All competitors will be required to include credit card information on entry forms, for deposit and to cover any additional expenses incurred during the horse show. Accounts may be settled via E-transfer or Credit Card. Credit Card transactions will incur a **3% processing fee**.

3. Entry forms MUST be signed in the office on arrival, before a competitor's number is released. A parent/legal guardian must sign for juniors. A trainer's signature is not valid.

4. Please list your coach's name on the entry form, if you ride with one, to facilitate the draws for class order and stabling.

5. Hors Concours rounds will be permitted.

6. Numbers must always be worn and visible while on the competition grounds with your horse.

7. Entries must use the official online entry form by entering online at <u>www.horseshowtime.com</u>.

8. Entries for each show must be received by: September 15th 2023

9. Incomplete entries will be considered late. In case of event being sold out, incomplete entries will not have a spot held.

10. Competitors are responsible for their own errors or those of their agents in preparation of their entry forms.

11. Entries received after the closing date will be subject to a \$50 late fee.

12. The management reserves the right to limit entries in any division and to refuse or decline any entry without being liable for compensation or damages.

13. Due to limited stabling, we will not be accepting non-competing entries.

14. All Riders must have a valid Horse council of British Columbia membership for 2023.

ADD / SCRATCHES

1. Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official Entry Closing Date but prior to the start of the show, upon presentation of a valid veterinarian certificate, will be charged \$150 scratch fee. Veterinary Scratches after start of the show will forfeit their stabling costs.

2. Non-veterinarian scratches, after the entry closing date, will not be refunded their deposit and will incur a \$150 scratch fee.

3. Horse substitutions will be permitted, prior to the start of the show, for a fee of \$50.00.

4. Class adds, and scratches made prior to the show office closing the day prior will incur no penalty. Adds or scratches after closing, or the day of will be assessed a \$10.00 add fee per class; in case of a sellout, where same day adds are closed, scratches will not be refunded. Entries that fail to scratch before the end of the competition, will not be refunded. Entries may change classes for a \$10.00 charge.

5. Management reserves the right to refuse adds after the closing, or the day of. Deposits will not be refunded to entries who fail to start by the closing on the previous night.

6. Any show scratches before September 15th will not incur a scratch fee.

7. Any show scratches after September 15th will forfeit \$150 of their entry deposit.

PRIZES & CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Ribbons will be given to sixth place in all classes unless otherwise specified.

2. Points for championships shall be awarded following HCBC Rules.

3. The Champion and Reserve titles shall be awarded to the two horses that have accumulated the most points performing over the courses in the division in which they are being shown. In the case of a tie the Championship and/or Reserve title shall be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points in the final competition of the division. Further ties will be decided by the penultimate competition in the division.

4. A minimum of 3 entries in a division are necessary for division championship and reserve prizes to be awarded.

NUMBERS / VACCINATIONS

1. All competitors will receive a number for each horse. It is important in practice areas and competition rings that the horse number are clearly displayed. Jumper riders will be asked to use a bridle number or a printed competition number around their waist or pinned to their saddle pad, while hunter competitors will be issued a printed back number. The use of a wrong number or having no number may result in disqualification from the competition.

2. All entries must have current vaccinations (within last 6 months). Proof of vaccination can be emailed to krchorseshowtime@gmail.com.

All horses attending this competition must be vaccinated.

3. Proof of Vaccination - You must provide proof of vaccination for ALL of your horses on the grounds, showing or not Required Vaccines are: EHV 1 & 4 (Rhino) – within 6 months (180 Days)

4. Back Numbers will not be issued until the Health Requirements are met. Show manager may require any horse with missing/incomplete/expired Vaccination Records to be placed under observation until the requirements are met.

5. Keep copies of your Vaccination records in your tack room or in your truck/trailer. You may be asked by IDC personnel to present your health papers at any time.

6. Haul ins: If you haul in and out daily, keep copies of your Vaccination records in your truck/trailer. You may be asked to present these records. The haul in parking lot will be checked daily. If proper records are not immediately available, the horse(s) must a.) Remain under IDC staff observation until the paperwork is presented, or b.) Will be asked to leave the grounds.

7. Haul ins may ONLY park in the designated areas (trailer parking area); haul ins MAY NOT park by the barns.




